

Wabikon Lake & Riley Lake – Laona (Forest County)

The lake is 129 acres in size; it has northern pike, large-mouth bass, and panfish. Lake is undeveloped as it is at edge of the National Forest. No large boats. Riley Lake is 217 acres in size, and has panfish and trout.

Boat Landing (yellow on map):

- In Laona, turn left from hwy 32 onto 32/8; drive 5.3 miles.
- After you see the “Leaving Nat’l Forest” sign, you will turn left on Potowatomi Road.
- Drive past Johnny’s Resort to boat landing. At the south end of Wabikon Lake, there is a passage to Riley Lake (marked Indian Lake on this map).

Scattered Rice Lake & Little Birch Lake – Laona (Forest County)

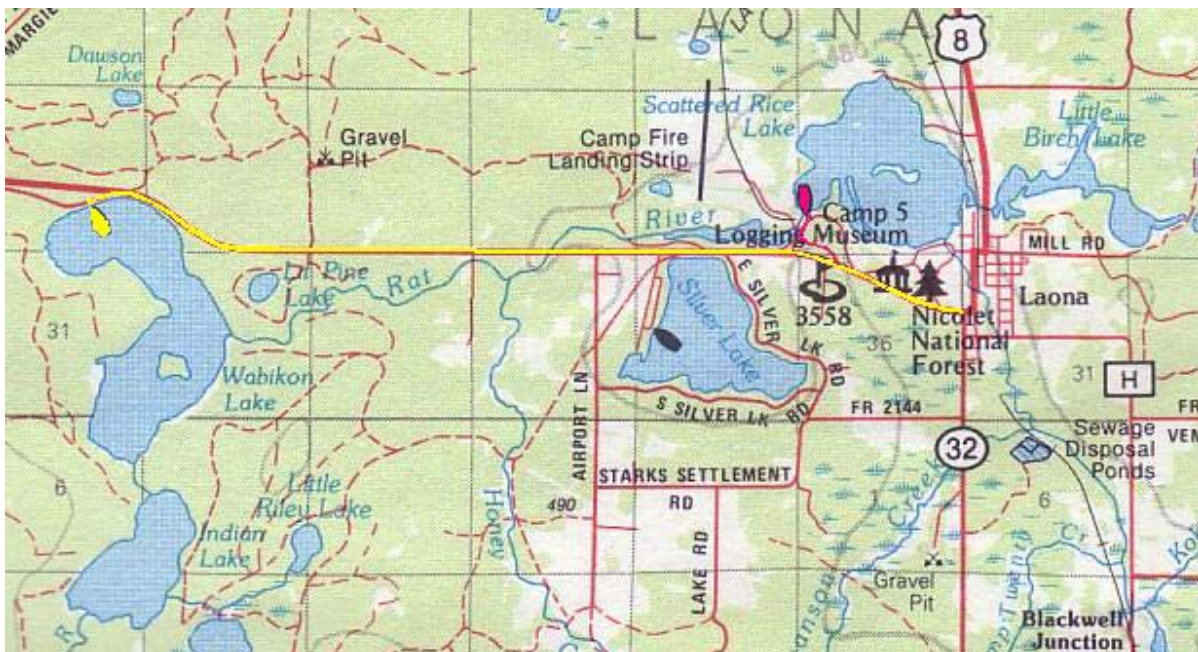
The lake is 459 acres in size; it has northern pike, large-mouth bass, and panfish. The boat landing is actually on the Rat River feeding into Scattered Rice Lake. The passage to the lake is weedy and filled with stumps, but you can easily see the channel. When you reach the lake, the stumps have been marked with small hot pink flags; watch for these on your return trip. You will see many fishing boats. We saw ten herons, loons, and ravens. On the east shore, where there are houses on hwy 8, look for a break in the houses. There is a passage to Little Birch Lake that passes under the railroad trestle.

Boat Landing (hot pink on map):

- In Laona, turn left from hwy 32 onto 32/8; drive 0.8 miles.
- Turn right on a road (not signed; it is across from Fairview Road and just before Conner Farm Road).
- You will see the boat landing on the right before you cross the Rat River.

Everyone should wear a PFD (personal flotation device).
